**COMMUNITY SERVICE /ACTIVITIES:**

In 2008, Tony founded the Marriage Enrichment Formation Program, (a variation of Marriage Encounter), a catholic church-affiliated organization that has enriched and/or saved the marriages of more than 400 couples (and counting) in southern California. The organization today is very much alive, active and dynamic. Tony currently serves as Shepherd, Speaker, Adviser and Counsellor to the group. He develops couple-speakers for their seminars and he, together with his wife, sits one-on-one with couples who have problems with their marriages. He believes that a good marriage begets a good family, a good family begets a good community, and a good community begets a good nation.

Tony is also active in the Filipino Cursillo movement in southern California. He has served as Rector, Rollista, medical officer, and various other leadership position in the cursillo movement.

He has joined and served in the many medical missions in the Philippines, mostly those sponsored by the USTMAA in Southern California.

He has sent and currently sending financial support to students for college scholarship in the Philippines. More than five students had graduated from college and they are now gainfully employed and supporting their families. Some scholars are still studying.

He has inspired and financially supported his high school classmates to band together and adopt poor elementary schools in the barrios. His Adopt-a-School program has donated many school supplies, books, computers, uniforms, shirts, school bags, slippers, umbrellas and food to some underserved elementary schools in Quezon province, an ongoing project, one school for three years at a time. This has garnered recognition from the PH Department of Education and Culture.
